SPRING GREETINGS, FRIENDS!

Like the seasons, the nature of animal welfare work is always changing. Part of my job is to make sure I keep my eye on the horizon so that we can build teams and strategies that allow us to be nimble and responsible with

our resources. Folks from as far away as Arizona and Arkansas contact AAHS to learn how to be best in class. We are grateful that organizations like Best Friends and the Association of Professional Humane Educators have asked us to speak at their annual conferences and the ASPCA calls on our staff to act as first responders in rescue efforts. Nationally and locally, we continue to develop programs that will keep pets in their homes, reduce their length of stay, practice zero euthanasia of healthy and treatable animals, and provide enrichment activities while they are at the shelter in their temporary home.

All the amazing progress on things like spay and neuter efforts to address overpopulation, reducing intake of stray and surrendered animals, and educating our community about responsible pet ownership has given us the chance to revisit our work with fresh eyes and a lot of input from you. How long have you been with Animal Allies?

Almost a year.

Where did you grow up?
Monticello and Brainerd, MN.

What do you love about Duluth? I love summers in Duluth and the beach. There are always people to meet. I like to be outside and I enjoy fishing. I like the trails and the scenery. There's a lot about Duluth that I didn't know existed until I moved here.

What do you like best about working for AAHS? The people and the environment. I get to work at my own pace and it's therapeutic. I don't have people standing over my shoulder telling me what to do and how to do it. Everyone's happy and outgoing here. I like the variety and that I get to work with both cats and dogs. It makes it easier to know what is going on with all of the animals.

What have you learned about working with cats and dogs? There are a lot of different personalities. I have learned the signs of how cats and dogs perceive and learn things. I am impressed with how a dog can turn around, from growling and hiding to being my best friend. A dog doesn't need to be like how he was raised.

Do you have any animals?

Not at this time. My landlord does not allow pets. I do want to get a cat at some point.

Give us your best animal-handling technique?

Don't just reach for a dog or walk up and grab it as fast as you can. Let it sniff your hand. Take your time. Watch for signs. Stop and have patience.

What's your favorite pet story? There have been quite a few. Cruz is one of my favorites for sure. He's still a puppy and has been adopted twice and has come back both times. He's been to R & R Dog Training twice and has learned how to play nice and gentle. He no longer jumps up on people and has more control. He's a super friendly dog but it's important that the adopters follow through with improving his behavior.

What are some of your talents? I like seeing things that others don't see. I see things in more detail than other people do. I am more of a listener than a talker. I like to train in volunteers and new staff. I like to lead by example and show people how to do this work. I enjoy landscaping and construction.

HUMANE EDUCATION IN THE CLASSROOM



Did you know that our Humane Education department does more than birthday parties and special events at the shelter? Education in our community is really the biggest part of our role at Animal Allies. Our Humane Education department focuses on educating youth and adults about the humane treatment of animals through our shelter programs, group speaking opportunities, and teaching in local classrooms.

Educating the youth in our community is a big focus for us here at Animal Allies. By the time this school year is over, we will have worked in over 100 classrooms since the Fall. That means that we are teaching in classrooms about three days a week, touching the lives of over 10,000 kids each school year! We work with all ages, all over the city (and in Duluth's neighboring communities too, of course). We have worked with youth from preschool age to college students and all ages in between.

Highlights of this year include the classrooms who had incorporated our visit into an animal care unit or a wish list supply drive for the shelter. Kids love to be helpful and feel so proud to be a part of something bigger.



So what does a typical classroom visit look like? We lead age-appropriate lessons about how to be safe and respectful around animals, how to help care for them as pets, and how to help animals in our community. We usually have a teaching assistant along with us: ambassador dogs

who have been through training and enjoy being around people. Usually, our lessons last 30-60 minutes per group.

We also have regularly scheduled meetings with some classrooms. Meeting with the same group of kids multiple times in a year allows us to cover more information and forge valuable relationships with students, teachers, and schools. Many classes also celebrate the end of the year with a tour of the shelter following our visits in their classroom.

Schools we have visited this year include Congdon Park, Laura MacArthur, Stowe Elementary, Denfeld and East

high schools, Proctor and Hermantown schools, UMD, Lowell, and many others.

There is a \$50 suggested per-session fee to help defray the



costs of transportation and staff time for classroom visits. A donation drive is a great way to generate funds if classes do not have financial resources available.

Thanks to generous grant support from the Kenneth A. Scott Foundation and the Irving Community Club Grant, we are able to waive the per-session fee for a limited number of classroom visits each year regardless of ability to contribute to the shelter.

Want us to come visit your classroom? Anybody can help make a visit happen: teachers, parents, and even students have reached out to schedule a lesson. In addition to classroom visits, we are also happy to come in during school breaks and have visited several keyzone and youth summer programs.

A FOSTER SUCCESS STORY; Say HELLO to CHOPPER!



We get many questions about what it's like to foster pets in your home. There are many types of foster situations we seek help with. Chopper's story is a medical foster case. A local shelter contacted Animal Allies to see if we could take Chopper in. While sweet, loving, and entirely

adorable, Chopper had some medical issues that needed addressing. A drainage tube in his side had been left in for too long, causing scar tissue to form. Chopper would have to be in foster care for up to 5 weeks following surgery to remove the tube.

Keeping an 8-week-old puppy calm so he can recover from surgery is a tough task. His foster mom tells us that chewing was a great distraction. "Bones, shoes, toys, pillows... once he felt at home, nothing was off-limits. Thankfully, he is a really mellow guy for a young puppy."

Chopper recovered from his procedure with flying colors. Once he was ready for adoption, his foster family acted as 'Adoption Ambassadors' and worked to find Chopper a home. At almost exactly three months of age, Chopper found his new home with a nearly-retired couple in the country. His new family reports that Chopper is happy and loves the trails around his new home.

NE'RE EXPECTING



Babies, that is! Spring is in full swing. Help us provide care for the homeless puppies, kittens, and their mothers this May by donating to our Springtime Wish List Drive. The donations collected will provide necessary babyspecific items needed to care for the puppies and kittens who will soon grace our shelter.

Each year hundreds of kittens, puppies, and their mothers arrive at the shelter. Some are stray, surrendered while pregnant, and sometimes babies arrive to us without mothers to care for them. Our staff and foster volunteers care for the tiny orphaned babes and provide a safe place for the mothers tending to their young. Orphans require round-the-clock care, with feedings every two hours. Tiny babies are unable to regulate their own body heat and need to be kept warm by being snuggled or wrapped up with a heat disk and blanket.

Feeding supplies, notably milk substitutes, are necessary and add up quickly. The Springtime Wish List Drive will provide much needed supplies for the fosters and staff who will care for the babies when they arrive.
