THE SILVER LINING

IMPROVEMENTS FOR ADOPTERS AND SHELTER PETS

The constant change and uncertainty throughout the current COVID-19 pandemic has had its share of difficulties. Our team has made sweeping changes to our daily operations, implementing new procedures in order to continue providing essential services for pets and people. We discovered opportunities, learned new ways of doing our work, and ultimately found new ways to serve the animals and people who count on us in their time of need.

One of our most significant changes has been to our Adoption process. People everywhere found themselves spending more time at home, with more time to do things that had been on their ‘future projects’ list. As you may have guessed, adopting a pet was at the top for many families!

To accommodate adopters and help as many pets as possible, we made very specific changes to our adoption program including the animal meet-and-greet process. Increased sanitation and cleaning protocols were implemented in order to adhere to COVID-19 guidelines. Staff who were able worked from home, visitors were limited to interested adopters only, and our volunteer team was cut to a minimal team.

So how has the adoption process changed? Because our shelter is closed to the public (ie; no visitors) adoptions are now done by appointment only. Pets are brought from their kennels to meet potential adopters in our doggie play yards or in the cat get-acquainted rooms. Adopters receive one-on-one service from our adoption team and get to meet the pet in a relaxed environment. So far, the new less-stress meet-and-greet process seems to have improved the experience for both pets and adopters.

Recent adopters have shared that their adoption experience felt very welcoming and personal. They have particularly enjoyed meeting the pet of their interest in a mutual space (rather than the kennels) and the one-on-one attention from our adoption team has been a big hit. Many adopters have said they are taking advantage of the time this quarantine has provided, allowing them to get to know their new furry companion on their own schedules and dedicate time to training.

Shelter animals are happier, too. While they can't tell us their thoughts, they have expressed their happiness through less barking and stress-induced destruction of beds, toys, etc. The dogs are more relaxed - bonding with our kennel team and dog buddy volunteers during their daily routines, and the kitties receive lots of extra attention from our staff and volunteers. Our medical and kennel staff have been able to streamline some of their processes, too, freeing up time to focus on special cases like our Healing Hearts & Paws pets Honey and Trio, and adjust to provide specialty care for our recent Basenji residents. This new adoption system has shown so many unexpected benefits that we are looking into ways to implement some of these processes permanently moving forward.



The life-saving silver lining? Our length of stay has gradually gone down a little bit each month. This means pets are here for a shorter period of time prior to adoption. Less time in a shelter = happier pets. The shorter kennel occupancy per pet also means more available kennel space for a different pet in need. This allows for even more furry little lives to be saved through our partnerships with regional rescue groups who are still overcrowded.

These life-saving changes are just a few of the ways that we have shifted our work to better serve the needs of our community. As this uncertain time of COVID-19 changes continues, Animal Allies will always focus on our core mission to help people and pets. 
During all of this, Animal Allies was still receiving animals every week including surrendered pets from the public, stray pets from the city of Duluth, and large transfers of dogs coming to us from out of state. A few of our Level 3 Dog Buddies who were trained in the transport process stepped up to help us bring

these dogs to Animal Allies where they would get a second chance at a loving home. These Dog Buddies also helped with walking and caring for these dogs while we were short staffed. We had several staff members who were in the vulnerable demographic and needed to stay home, so the extra help was much appreciated.

Our Foster Volunteers really deserve the spotlight, though, as they responded to our pleas for help in droves! Existing fosters opened their hearts and homes to dogs and cats in need of fostering, and we were inundated with over 200 new foster applicants from our community who wanted to help. This response was so inspiring! Thanks to these dedicated families and individuals, many of our shelter animals were temporarily placed in loving homes allowing our staff to concentrate on the pets in our care in need of more critical help.

As we continue to chart new paths through 2020, many of our supporters and volunteers have been asking, 'how can we help?' As you know, community support (in all of its forms) is necessary to ensure that our mission to help pets and people continues into the future. Pets in need continue to come to us for care every day no matter what is happening around us.

When it's difficult to volunteer or show up to help in person, making a financial donation to organizations you care about is a meaningful way to provide assistance. Nonprofit organizations like Animal Allies Humane Society can often stretch a dollar much further than when we shop for retail supplies as individuals.

We've rounded up some unique and creative tools for making charitable contributions in 2020. Some of these tools are unique to the Coronavirus pandemic, while others have been reliable giving options for many years. It's our sincere hope that these tools will help make giving possible for everyone now and into the future.

CORONAVIRUS SPECIFIC OPTIONS

On March 27th of this year, President Trump signed the largest relief package in U.S. history, extending aid to many struggling Americans through direct payments and expanded unemployment insurance. Individuals and businesses benefited from many other provisions included with this emergency act. Some individuals who were not displaced from their daily routines elected to give their stimulus check to charity, furthering the impact of the stimulus program. Here are two additional highlights that might pertain to our readers. *We have posted the entire CARES announcement on our website for your convenience.

- **RMDs Suspension for 2020**

The CARES Act suspends required minimum distributions (RMDs) during 2020. The relief provided by this provision is broad and applies to Traditional IRAs, SEP IRAs and SIMPLE IRAs, as well as 401(k), 403(b), and Governmental 457(b) plans. Furthermore, the relief applies to both retirement account owners as well as to beneficiaries taking stretch distributions. For individuals who turned 70 ½ in 2019, but did not take their first RMD in 2019 (and thus, would have normally been required to take their 2019 distribution by April 1, 2020, as well as a second RMD for 2020 by the end of 2020) do not have to take either their 2019 RMD or their 2020 RMD.

- **Charitable Deduction**

The bill enhances tax incentives for making charitable contributions. It creates a new above-the-line deduction of up to \$300 for charitable donations and relaxes limits on other charitable deductions to increase charitable giving during the COVID-19 epidemic. This allows individuals to claim a deduction even if they don't itemize. For the 2020 tax year, individuals can deduct up to 100% of their AGI for a charitable contribution. This includes cash contributions and donations of food, and they apply to both individuals and corporations. This deduction does not apply to donor advised funds.

WAYS TO GIVE ANYTIME



Maximizing impact of Donor Advised Funds (DAF)

A Donor Advised Fund (DAF) - also known as a Giving Account - is a charitable giving program that allows you to combine the most favorable tax benefits with the flexibility to support your favorite causes such as Animal Allies Humane Society.

Making gifts through Donor Advised Funds can provide you with substantial tax benefits:

Income tax; You can receive an immediate income tax deduction in the year you contribute to your DAF.

Tax-Free Growth; Any investments in your DAF can appreciate tax-free.

Estate Tax; Your DAF will not be subject to estate taxes.

Capital Gains Tax: If you fund your DAF with appreciated assets (securities, real estate, other assets, etc.) there is typically no capital gains tax due on the appreciation.

You can make a meaningful difference for animals by contributing through your DAF or Charitable Giving Account with a grant recommendation. Simply log into your DAF at your brokerage or fund manager, specify Animal Allies Humane Society as the recipient (Federal Tax ID: 41-0917362) and make your grant recommendation. Employer Matching Gift Programs

Many top local and national companies offer an Employer Matching gift program that doubles the value of your gift to Animal Allies Humane Society. Please ask your Human Resources representative for a form, complete it and send it to us along with your gift today.
